Acting Commissioner to release investigation report about the use of employee surveillance by a BC chicken catching organization

VICTORIA—On Wednesday, November 8, 2017, at 9:30 am, Acting Information and Privacy Commissioner Drew McArthur will release *Investigation Report P17-01: Use of employee surveillance by a BC chicken catching organization*.

The report examines whether a chicken catching company was authorized by the *Personal Information Protection Act* to use video surveillance to monitor its employees. Acting Commissioner McArthur launched the investigation in response to media stories about the company's practices.
