BC Information and Privacy Commissioner releases statement for Data Privacy Day 2026

VICTORIA – BC Information and Privacy Commissioner Michael Harvey released the following statement for Data Privacy Day, January 28, 2026:

“This year’s Data Privacy Day comes at a pivotal time for our personal information rights, which face pressures from multiple fronts: rapid advances in AI that rely on massive amounts of personal information, increasing polarization in our society, and the spread of surveillance.

“In the Information Age, our personal information, our data, is no longer just about us – it **is** us. Nearly every aspect of how we live flows from our personal information – from our social lives and our education to our healthcare and our democratic participation. Our personal information is central to our identities and having control over it means controlling how we participate in society – how we live our lives with dignity, as individuals with rights in our democracy.

“Advancing technologies provide us with challenges but also great benefits, including the opportunity to control our personal information more effectively than ever before. I call upon private and public sector organizations to innovate now, to enhance our privacy rights.”
